W. H. LYONS

BEACHBURG (Special) — The death of William Henry Lyons, Queen's Line, occurred suddenly in Toronto recently.

Born 59 years ago on the Gower Line, Westmeath township, Mr. Lyons was son of the late Edward Lyons and his wife, formerly Margaret Anderson. After attending local schools, he was employed with the International Nickel Co. Sudbury, before farming on the Lyons homestead. He married Miss Lillian Robinson in April, 1928. Retiring from farming, they lived for several years in Beachburg before moving to Queen's Line and he was employed with the Dominion Magnesium Company at Haley's. He was a member of St. Andrew's United church, Beachburg.

Surviving, besides his wife, are four sons, Donald, Pembroke; Willis and Gerald, Toronto and Wayne and one daughter, Miss Linda Lyons, at home. Another daughter, Miss Shirley Lyons, died a few years ago. There are seven grandchildren. One brother, Milton Lyons, Westmeath and three sisters, Mrs. Lawrence Jeffrey (Mabel), Beachburg; Mrs. William Needham (Emma), Arnprior, and his twin sister, Mrs. Ira Edmunds (Cora), Garson. A brother, Henry Lyons, died several years ago.

The funeral was held from the W. R. Reynold's Funeral Home to St. Andrew's United church,

Westmeath, conducted by Rev. James Hampson. A solo "Beyond the Sunset" was sung by Mrs. Fred Burgess accompanied by Mrs. R. D. Mullin. Burial was in Westmeath United Church cemetery.
