## Dr. J. C. Bradley Dies Thursday In Hospital

Dr. John Courtland Bradley, a former member of the Ontario Legislature for North Renfrew and a former mayor of Pembroke, died Thursday afternoon in the Cottage Hospital in his 77th year.

Dr. Bradley had lived in Pembroke since 1920 and in much of that period had been active in the life of the town and district. He served some years in the Town Council and was elected mayor in 1934. During his term of office he was elected to the Legislature and represented North Renfrew continuously until 1943.

Born near Vankleek Hill in Glengarry County, Dr. Bradley was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry John Bradley. He studied medicine at University of Toronto, graduating in 1911, and came to Westmeath the same year, where he practised until coming to Pembroke in 1920. After some years as a general practitioner, Dr. Bradley took post-graduate work at Edinburgh University, later resuming his practice in Pembroke, specializing in eye, ear, nose and throat disease. For several years he served as a coroner.

In 1915 Dr. Bradley married the former Sarah Bertha Reid of Westmeath who survives him. Also surviving are one sister, Mrs. F. L. Downey of Ottawa and a nephew, Henry Bradley, of Pembroke, who had lived with Dr. and Mrs. Bradley since the death of his father. Two brothers of Dr. Bradley predeceased him. Dr. L. G. Reid is a brother-in-law.

Funeral service will be held at 3 p.m. Saturday in the Malcolm & Deavitt chapel, Rev. W. C. Nicholson officiating, and burial will be in the Presbyterian Cemetery.
