—We to have until the 30th September 1899 to examine the Limits, and in the event of acceptance interest to be paid from June 30th 1899.—

—Supplies to be at cost and plant at value. Price \$400,000.⁰⁰, and, if we should desire it we are to have reasonable time for payment. Although not mentioned, we expect interest shall not exceed 5% per annum.—

Please let us know if this is correct, and if so, we have decided to send some of our men up at once to travel the limit.—

If our men go up we would be obliged for a letter to your Mr. Campbell, to give them what information and assistance he can.—
