

Beachburg Fair Has Fine Program

North Renfrew Society's
Show Set for Septem-
ber 26 and 27.

BEACHBURG, Ont., Sept. 21—Due to changes in the prize list for this year, a more than ordinarily successful fair is anticipated by officials of the North Renfrew Agricultural Society, under whose auspices it is being held this year, on September 26 and 27. Numerous features are planned in connection with it, one of which will be the county championship school parade on Wednesday, September 27. This will form up at the Beachburg public school at 1.30 p.m., led by the Kemptville Citizens' Band, which has been engaged to supply music for the day.

It is the desire of the directors that all schools in the district be represented in the parade, and children and teachers are notified that pupils not in the parade will be required to pay the regular admission charge to the grounds.

Another attraction will be a baseball game between Shawville and Beachburg, Wednesday, at 3.30 p.m.

Judged by present indications the entry list for this year's event will surpass even last year, which broke all records. Every effort is being made to make it an outstanding success, not only from the amusement standpoint but from the angle of agricultural displays.

A first-class midway has been arranged, while there will be a play presented in the evening, followed by dancing. The play will be given by the Ascension Players, of Ottawa.

The Kemptville Citizens' Band of 20 pieces has achieved quite a reputation and may be depended upon to contribute a popular program. Another feature is a slow automobile race, with prizes awarded to the driver who can go round the course the slowest in high gear, without using brakes or stalling engine.
